



# Offer discount coupons on Shopify product pages

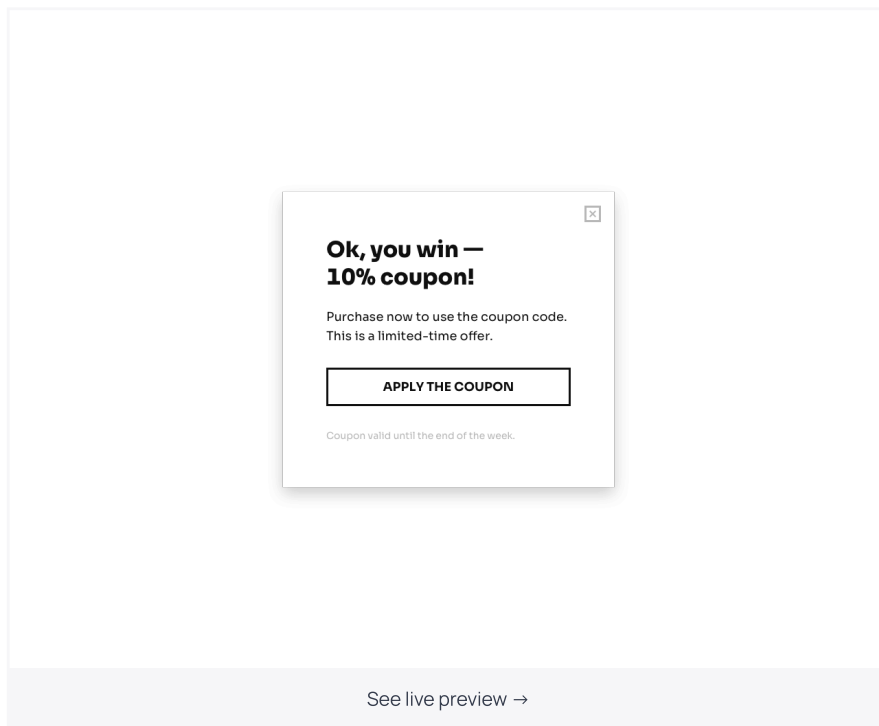
Nothing encourages customers to make a purchase more than discounts. But what's the most efficient way to offer a discount coupon?

**A lot of Shopify store owners will say it's popups.**

In this quick guide, we'll show you how to display a discount coupon on Shopify and allow customers to apply it upon button click. You'll be able to place special offers sitewide or on selected product pages based on various conditions, such as:

- product vendor
- cart total amount
- number of items in the cart
- and many more!

To offer a discount, you can use Getsitecontrol sticky bars, slide-ins, or modal popups like this one:



Once a customer hits the button, the discount coupon will be automatically applied to the cart and the popup will close.

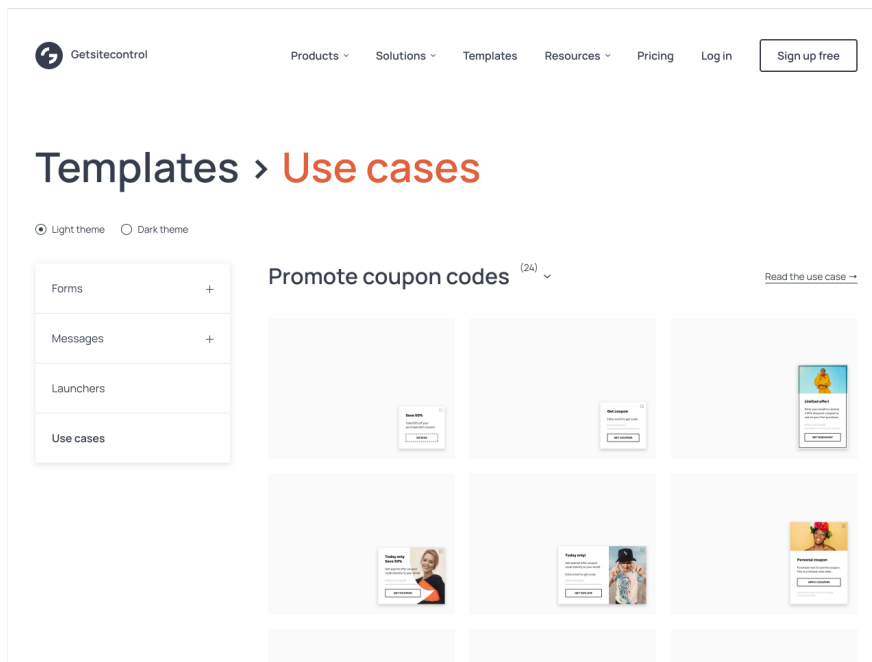
**Want to implement this scenario in your store? Below, we'll show you how to do that.**

Before you get started, you'll need to install Getsitecontrol on your website. [Find Getsitecontrol in the Shopify app store](#) and hit [Install](#) to start your free trial. Then follow the steps from the guide below.

## Step 1. Select a popup template

The fastest way to get started is by picking a template from the [popup gallery](#) designed

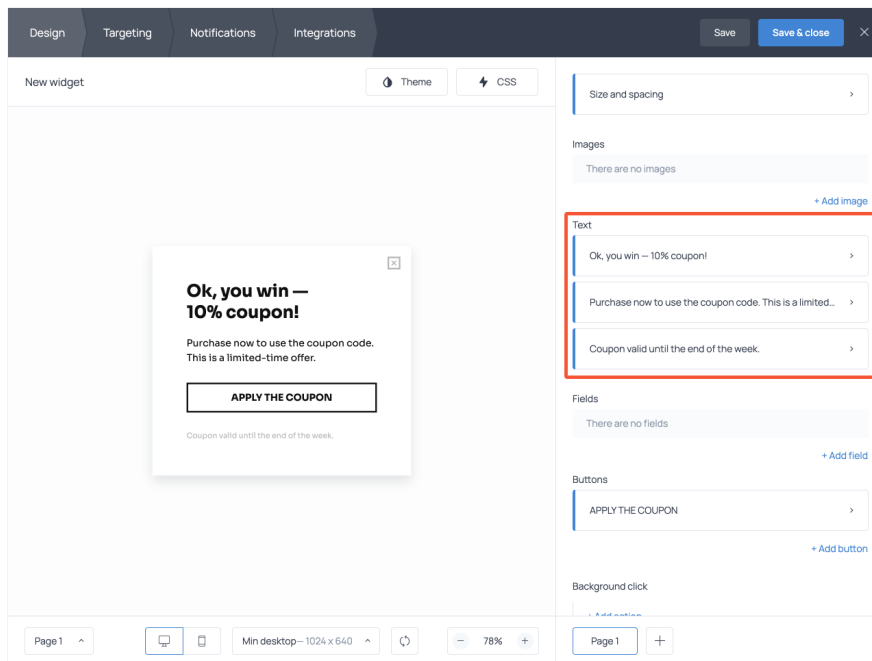
for Shopify. Click through the templates to see them in action until you find the one that meets your requirements.



Once you find a popup you like, follow the prompts on the right-hand side to add it to your Getsitecontrol dashboard.

## Step 2. Customize the copy and design

On the first screen you can change the offer description, text on the action button, and design. Just click on the elements you want to change and proceed with your adjustments.

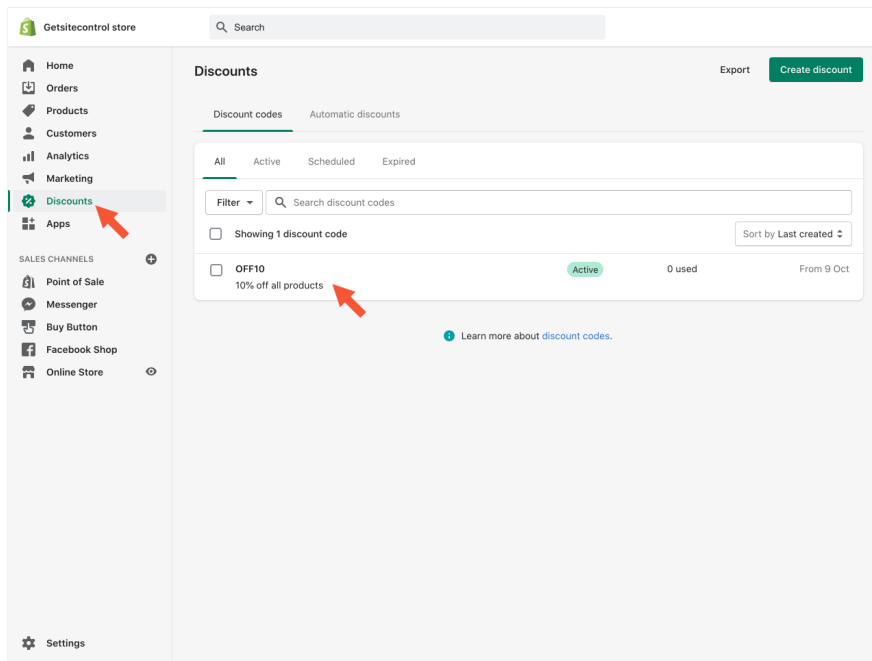


### Step 3. Select the discount code to apply

Your goal is to let customers apply the automatic discount coupon upon a button click, right?

**To implement that, you need to create a discount code in your Shopify dashboard and assign it to the button on the popup.**

That's quite easy! For starters, open your Shopify dashboard and go to [Discounts](#):



If you don't have an existing discount code, create a new one. Ours is named OFF10 🙌

Once the discount code is ready, you need to select the correct button-click action in the Getsitecontrol dashboard. To do that, click on the button text and find **Action**. Click **+ Add action** and select 'Apply discount'. Find the code you've created from the dropdown list and hit 'Done'.

Now, when your customers click the button, the coupon will be applied to the cart whether it contains items or not.

💡 Notice that you can choose to redirect a customer straight to the shopping cart or checkout as soon as they hit the button. This option will be handy if they already have items in the cart, and you want to nudge them into finalizing the purchase.

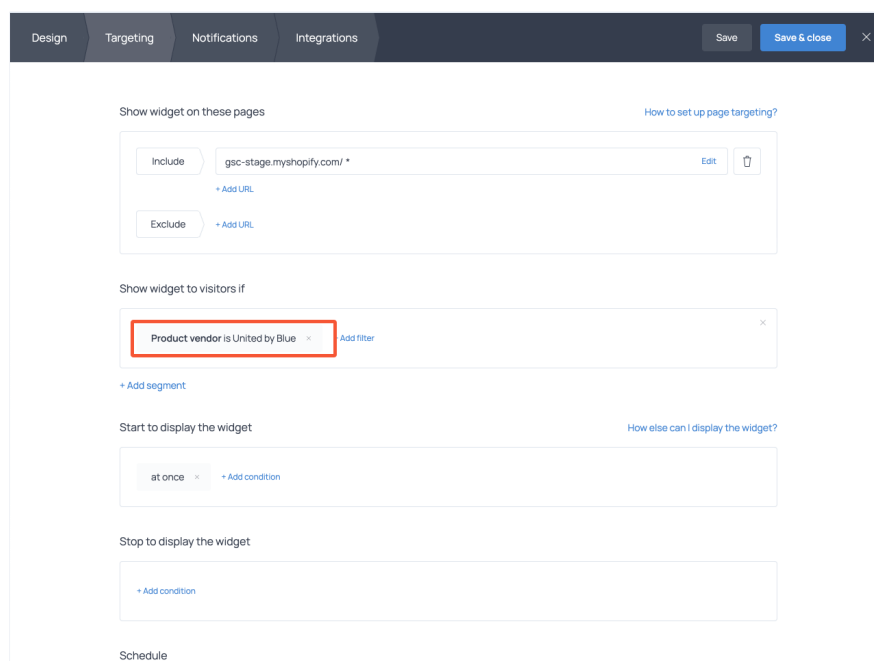
## Step 4. Decide where and when to show the discount coupon

The **Targeting** tab gives you full control of when your customers will see the popup. For example, you may only want to offer the discount under certain conditions, such as:

- if a customer is viewing selected product pages
- if a customer is interested in a certain vendor

- if a customer removes an item from the cart
- if the cart has reached a certain amount,
- if a customer is heading to exit

In our use case, we only want to offer a discount code on a particular vendor brand if we notice that the customer is viewing products by that brand. To create this condition, scroll down to 'Show widget to visitors if' and apply 'Product vendor' — then select the vendor you want.



Now the discount offer will only pop up on the pages that contain products by the corresponding vendor.

Keep in mind that by default the offer will be displayed at once. However, you can choose triggering condition, and display it when a customer:

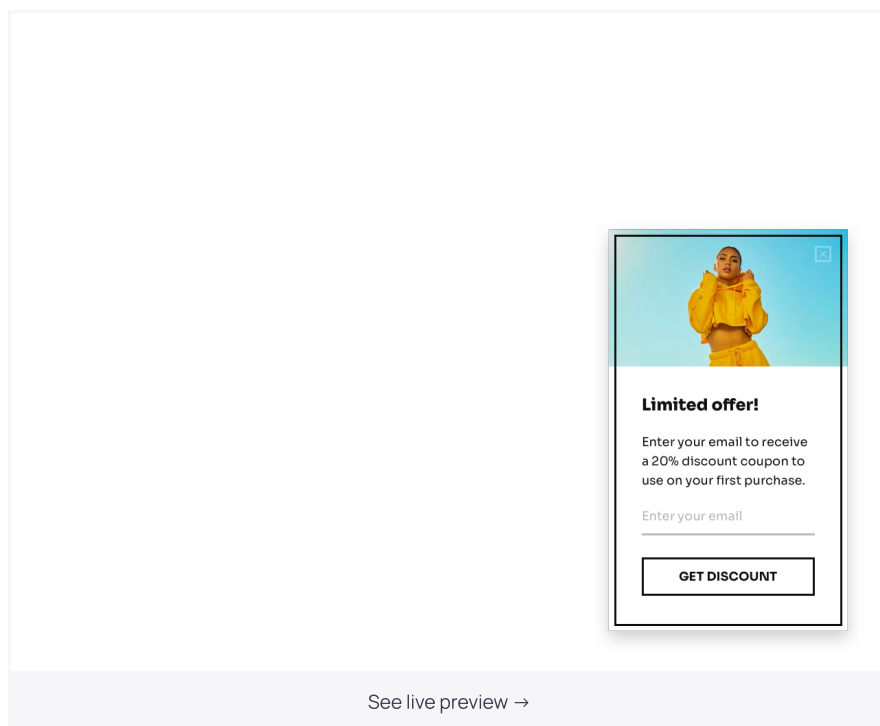
- starts heading to exit
- removes an item from the cart
- spends a certain amount of time in the store

To select the trigger, use the ‘Start displaying the widget’ menu, and remember to also select the condition for when to stop displaying the widget to the same person – unless you want to offer the same discount repeatedly.

As soon as you set all the parameters, you can save and activate the widget. It will instantly go live in your store.

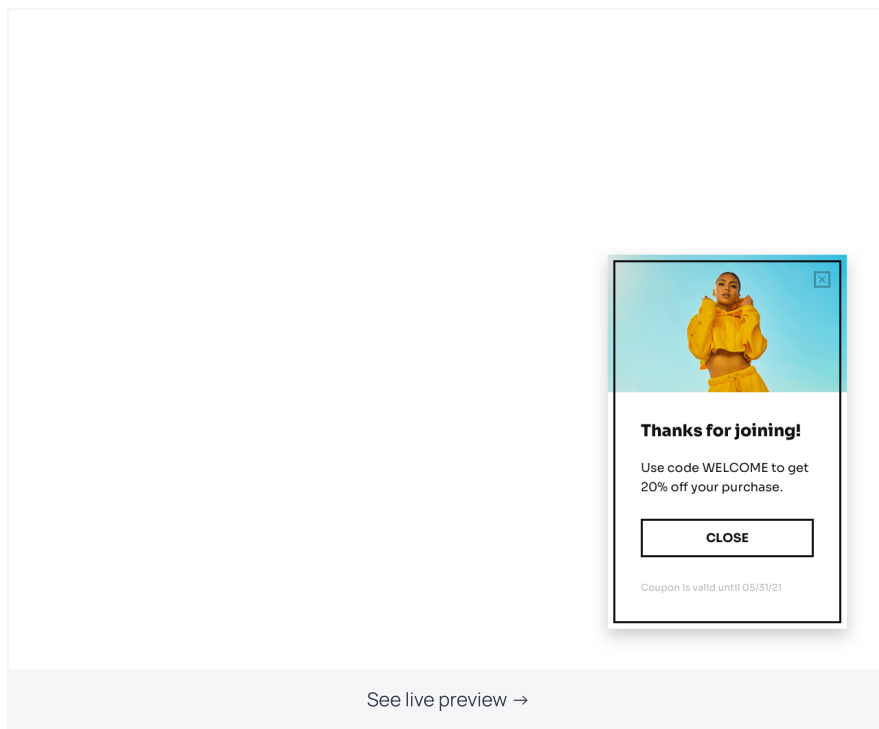
## Offer discount coupons in exchange for an email subscription

Before we wrap this up, here is another idea. As a Shopify store owner, you can offer a discount coupon in exchange for an email subscription. This way, you kill two birds with one stone: you get a new subscriber and a sale!



Now, how should you go about delivering the coupon to the new subscribers? You have two options.

First, you can include the coupon code to the submission success message, so that the customers copy and paste it at checkout 📌



The second option is to send the discount code to their inbox using a welcome email or the Getsitecontrol autoresponder feature – an automatic message sent to new subscribers

## Start promoting discount and get more sales

Coupons have proven to drive more sales for ecommerce, so if you're not promoting them in your store yet – it's about time! With Getsitecontrol, you can do that using popups, email subscription popups, and even surveys.
